With the aim of addressing the lack of information and education about Down syndrome, and with the goal of making a positive change in society, the project 'UpDownLife' is born.

UpDownLife is a new project that seeks to provide a solution to a problem that has existed for a long time; the lack of fair opportunities, resources and education for the parents of people with Down Syndrome. UpDownLife seeks an accessible solution for this people from love, empathy and inclusion.

Our social mantra is “**Support and community: empowering families with children with Down Syndrome towards a bright future.**”

A2. Contributions to UN goals

The mission of UpDownLife is to empower families with children with down syndrome, providing them with emotional support, reliable information and resources to maximize their children’s potential and promote their inclusion in society.

The vision of UpDownLife is become an empathic and informed community where people with Down Syndrome and their families have same opportunities and achieve a more inclusive society.


UpDownLife is has special essence, and we can relate it to the sustainable development objectives such as:

- By providing relevant and reliable information and emotional support, we promote the quality of the life of parents and children who live with this condition, we are covering the objective number three “Good Health and Well-being”
- Understanding the needs of people with Down Syndrome and helping their parents with this to facilitate better learning, we are covering the objective number four “quality education.”
- UpDownLife promotes respect for the rights and dignity of the people with disabilities and their families promoting a more just and inclusive society, reducing inequalities, we are covering the objective number teen “reduced inequalities” and Creating Peace, justice, and strong institutions, we are covering the objective number sixteen.
- Creating a community of solidary, the exchange of knowledge between parents and with experts is facilitated, strengthening alliances to address shared challenges, we are covering the objective number seventeen “partnership for the goals.”

B1. Target issues

According to the data from INEGI (National Institute of Statistics and Geography in Mexico.)

and the ministry of health of the government of Mexico, 7.1 million of the 130 million inhabitants in Mexico suffer from some type of disability. According to INEGI, 1 on 650 inhabitants is born with the situation of Down Syndrome (INEGI, 2022), and the result is approximately 220,000 people with this condition in the country and the registration data according to the Down Syndrome Veracruz Foundation, there at least 75,000 cases in the state of Veracruz. (Perdomo, 2023) Unfortunately, in Mexico there is little information and support on this important issue, the most of information used comes from that provided by private non-profit foundations, observations, and surveys and interviews with parents with children with this condition.



The main problem we find is that parents of children with Down Syndrome have significant challenges in guiding and motivating their children in the cognitive development and reaching their maximum potential.

Parents are the main guide and pillar in the foundations of parenting and development for their children. People with this condition need the same and even more support for the correct development of their abilities and skills, but, unfortunately, the lack of information, support and opportunities, make guiding their children correctly a challenge.

For parents, social stigma and negative expectations can affect their confidence and self-esteem, hindering their ability to overcome the unique challenges associated with raising a child with Down syndrome.

These complications can impact the emotional well-being and development of both parents and children, creating a family environment that requires comprehensive and specific support to overcome obstacles and foster positive and meaningful growth.

Some testimonials from parents with children with Down syndrome are as follows:

“Being born with this genetic alteration forces people and their families to face socio-cultural barriers, stigmatization, discrimination, school abuse, as well as exclusion in the health, education and social assistance systems.” (Palacios, 2024)

“Support must start in the family, because a person who knows that they are loved and supported by their loved ones will always get ahead.” (Flores, 2022)

“We are working a lot at the family level because inclusion starts in the heart, it is worth taking them to therapy, to sport and for them to be able to choose and develop skills. There is a lack of information.” (Perdomo for “Imagen del Golfo” 2023)

These testimonials are the reason and justification for approaching the issue from a family perspective, in this case, the parents.

B2. Root causes

During the research for this project, we observed that there are various causes of the problem, however, the most influential one is the lack of information and education about this condition, both in society and parents who have children with Down syndrome.

In testimonials from Carolina Perdomo (Founder of the Down Syndrome Foundation Veracruz) and Cariño Martínez (Mother of Ian, a 6-year-old boy with Down syndrome), they affirm that the main cause of the problem is the lack of information and education within families. There are no government or private institutions that

can provide adequate solutions for the entire process of care, guidance, and development of children. This lack generates all the complications in the proper development of children's cognitive skills.


However, it's important to mention that it's not the sole cause, as we managed to identify other contributing factors to the problem, for example.

- The shortage of specialized resources and the associated social stigma.
- Medical and therapeutic care is often not adequately covered.
- The lack of resources on the part of parents to go to a specialized school or organization.
- The lack of emotional support hinders parents' ability to guide their children's cognitive development.

B3. Current solution landscape

Currently in Mexico, there is little information on the subject and very few organizations, foundations, or institutions seeking to help parents and/or guardians of people with Down syndrome. The vast majority of these entities focus on providing direct care to people with Down syndrome, which is commendable. However, it is necessary to recognize that it is not only about people with this condition but also about their immediate environment, primarily the parents.

Our interviewee confirm the facts that, while there are current solutions, they are not sufficient, or they lack the right focus and opportunities.

“Throughout these years I have been involved with foundations and associations, mainly what is RED DOWN which is specifically for doctors and specialists, and also RED FUTURO in which they will give you talks and information, but there really are not many foundations for Down people specifically in Veracruz and its surroundings”.
(Martinez, 2024)

Based on the above, investigating what real solutions we can find to address this issue, we found that there are very few options that can provide a solution. The current solutions are as follows, presented with their pros, cons, and potential implementation issues.

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These solutions are offered by various institutions across the country (Mexico), which aim to support this community in different ways.

And these solutions are offered by the following organizations or foundations.

Fundación Jonh Langdon Down: The John Langdon Down Foundation is a leading institution in Mexico and the world that provides educational, medical and psychological care to children, adolescents and adults with Down syndrome and their families.

"It was created in Mexico City on April 3, 1972, by Sylvia G. Escamilla, and is currently the headquarters of the Mexican School of Art Down and creator of the chain of coffee shops "Tres 21 Arte Café". (Fundación Jonh Langdon Down, 2024)

Fundación Síndrome de Down Veracruz: The "Fundación Síndrome de Down Veracruz" is created by a loving and supportive mother, who since her son's diagnosis prepared and studied to provide support to him and other people with the condition, as well as their families who need the support of a community to move forward. There are currently approximately 50 members of this foundation.

"At the foundation we focus on making parents understand that having a child with Down syndrome is not something that should scare them. We hold talks, meetings and courses, and we also want the kids to develop their skills in both sporting and

artistic events." (Carolina Perdomo Director of the foundation "Síndrome de Down Veracruz, 2024)

Red Down: We are the most complete network of specialists in medical, therapeutic and family support for your loved one with Down syndrome. (Red Down, 2023)

Red Futuro: An altruistic movement made up of entrepreneurs and volunteers that seeks to create strategies to help vulnerable causes or groups, mainly through foundations or agents of change. (Red Futuro, 2024)

B4. Solution to implement

The solution that UpDownLife proposes is the creation of a comprehensive web platform that provides information, guidance and support through resources provided by experts in the field.

This platform would contain accurate data on Down syndrome, as well as practical advice and strategies based on the research of doctors, psychologists and other specialists in the condition.

This platform is planned to be divided into sections, so that users can prioritize their needs. The highlighted sections are:

Section 1: Educational Content: This would include detailed information about the condition, guides endorsed by doctors, psychologists, or specialists for parents, to address different aspects of caring for and educating their children, promoting their development, communication, and autonomy. All of this presented through multimedia content to make the information accessible and understandable for users. In this section, with the aim of addressing the lack of education and information about this condition, we plan to create a designated space to inform, advise, and motivate parents, and it is worth noting that all information will be endorsed by studies from specialists.

Section 2: Support Services: Creation of virtual and in-person events where people with Down syndrome can showcase their skills, promoting inclusion and acceptance

in society. Discussion forums and support groups moderated by professionals, where parents can share experiences, ask questions, and receive emotional support from individuals who have gone through similar experiences. Directory of local and national organizations that offer additional services and resources for families affected by Down syndrome.

Section 3: Other Support Opportunities: Opportunity to access entrepreneurial spaces, where individuals with this condition can offer products created by them. Promote the participation of these individuals in certain jobs, meaning updating job listings for capacities and skills they develop. Emotional support network for parents. This section is justified by the fact that both individuals with Down syndrome and their families need opportunities that foster their autonomy. In the specific case of parents, they need emotional support so they don't feel alone in this process.

Furthermore, it is necessary to consider that to develop this project, continuous evaluation of the quality and relevance of the content offered is required, ensuring ongoing updates of information. For this, it is necessary:


- Collection of feedback and testimonials from users to continuously improve the platform and adapt it to the changing needs of the community.
- Collaboration with specialists, organizations, and healthcare professionals in this condition to ensure high standards and broader reach for those in need.

Overall, with this solution, we aim to create a significant impact by providing parents with the tools and support needed to effectively guide the cognitive development of their children with Down syndrome.

B5. Solution uniqueness

C1. Engagement strategy

Once stakeholders have been identified, a communication strategy with a clear message is sought, which is to present the project as a platform of support and resources for families of children with Down syndrome. All of this through a marketing campaign which will present the following foundations:

- Sharing inspiring stories of families and individuals with Down syndrome who have found support and overcome obstacles.
- Showing how the project can make a positive difference in the lives of those affected. The resources available on the platform will be highlighted, such as educational information, support groups, and inclusive events, and explaining how these resources can help stakeholders face challenges and achieve their goals.

Efforts will be made to invite healthcare professionals and leaders of non-profit organizations to endorse the project and contribute their expertise.

Finally, as a sensitization and education campaign while the platform is in an Alpha version, we will organize events, webinars, and social media campaigns to educate the community about Down syndrome and promote inclusion to facilitate the participation of individuals with Down syndrome in any activity.

C2. Social support campaign performance

The social impact project "UpDownLife" aims to be sustainable over time without the need to affect the economy of these families, as we know that not everyone has opportunities, which is why they may not have the ability to take them to a specialized institution at times. Therefore, in the table, we explain what our main sources of income would be, highlighting primarily donations, advertising, and collaborations.

The following are our planned sources of funding, which we believe are the most accessible and feasible for this social impact project.

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D. Learning Curve

The development of this project has involved each of us in a multidimensional learning curve that encompasses empathy and specialized knowledge, as well as technical, management, and sustainability skills. This has been very interesting but challenging as we encountered different barriers and limitations, but the positive impact on the lives of families and social inclusion make the effort worthwhile and motivate us to develop this idea. Below, we describe some of the stages and key lessons from this process:

With the material provided by the SBC, we were able to lay the groundwork for building a solid structure for the creation of a social project, aiming to make an impact on families with a member with Down syndrome, correctly addressing and focusing on the problem at hand. We started this project with a completely different idea; we planned to simply gather existing information about the proper development of skills in children with Down syndrome and present it through a platform, website, or application. However, we found very little information, both from reliable and unreliable sources. With this, we understood that they are a social group that is neglected here in Mexico. There is no real support for these individuals or their families. By understanding this, we were able to grasp the daily challenges, the barriers they face, and the emotional, informational, and resource needs they have. The SBC is about making a social impact, and what better way to start than by trying to offer real solutions to a social group that is neglected here in Mexico.

In this project, we reached a point of personal growth, understanding that, to make a social difference, we must start with something and take one step at a time. We believe that inclusion is not about bringing them into our community, but rather about us breaking the patterns established by our society and including ourselves in their world. It's about letting them show us who they truly are and what they are capable of.

Beyond data collection and information gathering through digital means, it was crucial to develop an empathetic understanding of the emotional, social, and

personal experiences of these families in order to truly understand what they feel from an internal and personal perspective. They face these challenges on a daily basis, and by doing so, we can offer them effective and respectful solutions. We learned and recognize that despite having a different condition, it does not stop them from carrying out their activities, in which they can excel, particularly in artistic activities, demonstrating that they have talent just like any other human being, but they need support.

We plan to continue improving as we progress through rounds in the SBC. Despite not having a clear idea of what we had to do, we learned not to give up, to take initiative or leadership when necessary, and that with effort, dedication, and a bit of discipline, we can achieve any goal. So, just as we hope the project develops better little by little, we also hope the same for ourselves, that we continue to develop new skills and abilities and improve the current ones, as that is the importance of everything, continuous improvement.

Specifically, the learning curve of each team member was as follows:



- I have more knowledge for development and maintenance of web platforms.



- I identified that I don't have so much confidence in myself and that in really stressful situations I lost control, but my team was always by my side to motivate me.


